# TERMS OF REFERENCE (TOR) – CONNECTOR

# 1. ORGANIZATION BACKGROUND

A United Nations agency responsible for providing humanitarian and developmental aid to children worldwide. The organization works in over 190 countries and territories to save children's lives, defend their rights, and help them fulfil their potential, from early childhood through adolescence. The agency works with government and partners to ensure that every child in India has access to clean water and safe sanitation facilities, and practices good hygiene behaviours. Collaboration and convergence are a vital feature of the Agency's Country Programme in India, where WASH is positioned as cross-cutting support contributing towards results in all aspects of a child's survival, growth, and development. The WASH programme is also positioned to prevent malnutrition and preventable diseases, reduce neonatal mortality, and improve education outcomes.

The UN Agency supports the Government of India's flagship programmes, including the Swachh Bharat Mission, the Jal Jeevan Mission and WASH in Schools (including preschools called 'Anganwadi's). The agency also supports WASH in health care facilities and district-wide WASH interventions, supporting planning and implementation and incorporating behavior change into state and national guidelines and costed plans. To support lagging states and districts, the UN agency works in 16 states and 192 districts, technically supports the Government, assists in alternative service delivery approaches, and mobilizes public institutions and partners, including the private sector, around WASH services. The agency has expanded its programme from rural to urban areas, where the urban poor are often left out of the sanitation equation.

#### 2. RATIONALE

Government of Bihar has made significant progress in drinking water supply and sanitation for inclusive development of the State. Har Ghar Nal Ka Jal, the State flagship programme with an aim to provide access to piped water supply to every household through FHTC has been reached more than 95.75% of households as of December 2024 as per JJM Dashboard. Though the coverage is near to the saturation, operation, and maintenance of the PWSS is critical to ensure interrupted water supply and behavioral aspects plays a significant role for its effective functionality.

Swachh Bharat Mission (Gramin)/Lohiya Swachh Bihar Abhiyan (LSBA) has been playing a critical role with an aim to eliminate open defecation and ensure cleanliness and hygiene in the rural areas of the State. It has achieved notable success in recent years with persistent efforts from the Government and development partners. The state is now working towards sustaining open defecation free status with relevant programming in areas of ODF Sustainability (ODFS) & ODF Plus. Water and sanitation facilities have increased steadily across public institutions i.e. Schools, AWCs, and Healthcare facilities. However, effective operation and maintenance both household level as well as institutions is critical to sustain the infrastructure to get the benefits out of it.

Bihar, one of India's most populous states, is highly vulnerable to climate change. Rising temperatures, changing precipitation patterns and increased frequency of floods and droughts threaten agriculture, water resources and human health. Bihar's flat topography, dense population and limited infrastructure exacerbate flood risks, particularly during monsoons. Climate change also impacts agricultural productivity, affecting livelihoods and food security. State's Jal-Jeevan-Hariyali Mission is an ambitious multi stakeholder program aimed at addressing issues of water conservation, ground water recharge, afforestation, agro reforms and alternate energy promotion, and making the State climate resilient.

At this crucial juncture, Knowledge Management (KM) plays a vital role across WASH and CCES program area to address the complex challenges and ensure sustaining the gains of various State / National flagship programs for the long-term benefit of women and children in the State. In addition, KM ensures that WASH services are delivered effectively, with access to relevant

knowledge, expertise, and resources. It facilitates community engagement and participation in WASH and CCES initiatives, promoting ownership and sustainability. It helps capacity building of key stakeholders and promotes collaboration among government agencies, CSOs, and private sector organizations, reducing duplication of efforts and improving resource utilization. KM ensures that decision-making is informed by relevant, accurate, and up-to-date data and research and facilitates the sharing of best practices and lessons learned, promoting evidence-based decision-making, and improving program effectiveness and scaling up of successful interventions, promoting wider impact and coverage.

#### 3. PURPOSE OF ASSIGNMENT

The purpose of the assignment is to assess the KM systems, identify gaps and develop strategies to improve knowledge sharing and management across the WASH & CCES programme areas of the UN agency. One of the core elements of the TA is to develop and implement KM systems, tools, and processes tailored to the needs of WASH and CCES stakeholders for the different national/state flagship programs/schemes like SBM, JJM/JJHM, MGPNY, SBSV/SVP, Kayakalp, Mission LiFE etc. Develop and deliver training programs to build the capacity of stakeholders in KM, WASH, and CCES are critical areas of support to be extended as part of the TA.
